Eddie was a gentle soul and never bragged but he sometimes shared terrifying battle stories. He drove army trucks loaded with supplies which he had to deliver to battle war zones. He recalled the rough roads he traveled in Vietnam and bridges he had to cross, never knowing if they would blow up as he crossed over them. Sometimes the bridges did blow up as he left them in the dust looking through his rear-view mirror. He recalled with elation and a sense of pride that he survived and made it through in the nick of time for not all of the trucks in the convoy made it.
