After graduation he joined the military during the Korean Era and was stationed in New Mexico. Later, he went to work for Cal Trans in the San Diego area and eventually returned to SLO and taught at Cal Poly in the Agricultural Department until his retirement. While working at Cal Poly, in 1968, he applied to teach in Zambia, Africa and moved his family of 6 there for 3 years. It was an amazing opportunity and adventure for the entire family.

JP was active in the communities he lived in. He was on the Cal Poly BBQ team during

his years there. He was an Elk ruler in the SLO and Oceano clubs. He belonged to the American Legion and volunteered at every opportunity. He kept active into his 92 nd year playing tennis and golf throughout the county. He resided in a community living park and volunteered with the activities. He was a social man who enjoyed people.

He is preceded in death by his wife Marlene in 2011 and is survived by his four children and their spouses; James & Cathy Webster, Lydia & Glen Bohard, Ardith & Stuart Skow and Steve & Dianne Webster. He leaves a growing family of 8 grandchildren and spouses, 6 great-grandchildren and 1 great-great-grandchild.
